Pastor Boudon preaches the sermon in English, followed by a brief summary in Spanish.

Sunday school. St. James offers a full Sunday school program for adults and children immediately after worship every Sunday morning. There is Bible study for adults and Christian education for children.

Monthly Healing. St. James offers a healing liturgy as a part of our normal worship service on the third Sunday of the month, replacing the Prayers of Intercession.

#### **From the Pastor**

In his letter to the Romans. Paul wrote the following: "Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all (12:14-18)." These words seem increasingly appropriate given what transpired in Charleston, SC, on June 17, when a 21-year-old white man shot and killed nine African-Americans who had gathered in the basement of Emmanuel AME Church to study the Bible. As you heard me say in church that following Sunday, one of the pastors who was killed -The Rev. Clementa Pinckney -- was a classmate of mine in seminary and was an awesome human being. Clem, as he was known to those who knew him personally, lived the words of St. Paul both in his role as pastor and in his position as a state senator, where he consistently fought for those who had no power and those who were in need.

In the aftermath of this horrible event, South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley urged the General Assembly to pass a measure that would remove the Confederate flag from the grounds of the Capitol. But while this represents a step in the right direction, it does not address the deep-seated hatred and racism that continues to afflict American society. Consequently, those of us who claim to follow Christ must heed the words of St. Paul and take whatever steps we can to eliminate the plague that is racism. We must live in harmony with one another and live peaceably with all.
